EVACUEE HOUSING SCAMS

The District Attorney's Office of the County of Santa Cruz has received several complaints regarding housing scams concerning individuals and families looking for temporary housing as a result of the current CZU Lightning Complex Wildfire.

Protect yourself from these scams by following these guidelines:

- 1. Do not give a deposit through a wire transfer or other electronic means without first seeing the rental unit.
- 2. Never pay for anything with gift cards.
- 3. Verify ownership of the property through the Santa Cruz County Recorder's website online portal and/or assessor's office online service.
- 4. In general, landlords do not offer discounts for paying multiple months in advance. If this is offered, make sure to double check validity of rental.
- 5. Craigslist is a place scams are prevalent. Be very careful if renting through a Craigslist rental offering.
- 6. Report any suspicious listings to Craigslist, or to the website upon which the rental unit is listed.
